# In Memoriam William "Bill" J. McMillian Former Pine Crest School President and FCIS Honorary Lifetime Director

Mr. McMillan was an extremely proud alumnus and leader of Pine Crest School, and the students, faculty and staff were very special to him. He served as a teacher and administrator before being named President of Pine Crest in 1966. During his 43-year professional career, he led the expansion of the Fort Lauderdale campus from an independent day and boarding school, primarily serving children of winter visitors, to a full-time college preparatory school. In 1987, Mr. McMillan accomplished a merger of Pine Crest with Boca Raton Academy creating Pine Crest School at Boca Raton, which was later named the William J. McMillan Campus in his honor.

During his career, Mr. McMillan planted the seed for Pine Crest's renowned reputation in Florida and throughout the U.S. He served as President of the Florida Council of Independent Schools from 1974-1976, Southern Association of Independent Schools, and Florida Association of Academic Nonpublic Schools. Mr. McMillan was the first independent school head from Florida to be elected to the Board of the National Association of Independent Schools.

On March 9, 2014, 3:00 p.m., a Celebration of Life memorial service in his honor will be held at Pine Crest School's Stacy Auditorium, 1501 NE 62nd Street, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33334.
