FCIS 21st Century Learning Academy June 18-20, 2014

In mid-June, close to 50 dedicated independent school teachers attended the 21st Century Learning Academy at Corbett Preparatory School in Tampa. Matt Wilson, Director of School Operations and Technology at Jackson-ville Country Day School, kicked off the Academy with an introduction to Edmodo, offering ideas for how to use this learning management platform to collaborate with colleagues and students. Robert Ponzio, Chair of the Fine Arts Department, and Jason Stahl, Band Teacher, both at Oak Hall School, gave an inspiring presentation about their global education program and the personal interactions and creative collaboration that their students have developed with schools and communities around the world. They provided participants with strategies and resources to start developing global education programs in their own schools. Dr. Joan McGettigan, Director of Educational/Information Technology at North Broward Preparatory School, shared a list of the "must have" apps for creating assessments and podcasts, annotating infographics, collaborating with colleagues and so much more.

On the second day, Tom Pilecki, educator, musician, and co-author of <u>From STEM to STEAM</u>, highlighted the value of integrating the arts into STEM, shared practical strategies for authentic integration, and demonstrated successful projects from this movement. In her hands-on session, Susan M. Bearden, Director of Information Technology at Holy Trinity Episcopal Academy, showed participants how to use *Twitter* as a professional development tool to build personal learning networks, connect with colleagues and follow leaders in education. Rita Kienle, Academic Technology Integrationist, and Lynn Wilbur, Mathematics Teacher, both from Trinity Preparatory School, demonstrated how to "flip" a classroom and suggested free tools to get started. In her interactive session, Dr. Denise Spirou, Head of The Weiss School, engaged participants in fun lessons designed to captivate 21st century learners in the classroom. Dr. Joan McGettigan returned to give a presentation on using *Google* as a learning system and taking advantage of all its useful tools for teaching and learning. Dottie Smay and Courtney Walker, both Maker-Media Specialists at Shorecrest Preparatory School, introduced participants to the "Maker Movement". They shared resources, equipment, and activities for fostering a "maker mentality" and creating a "makerspace" for project-based learning in their school.

On the last day, Dr. Danielle Herro, Assistant Professor of Digital Media and Learning at Clemson University, presented research and statistics that support gaming and game-like environments to hone 21st century skills. She detailed large-scale initiatives and classroom examples using video games for learning through meaningful play. Dr. Elizabeth Shaunessy-Dedrick, Associate Professor of Gifted Education, College of Education, University of South Florida, wrapped up the Academy with her session on creativity. She introduced different conceptions of creativity, presented research on cultivating creativity, and offered strategies for nurturing creativity in students. Participants left the Academy energized and eager to use and share what they learned about 21st century learning in their schools.

Special thanks to Dr. Joyce Swarzman and Corbett Preparatory School for hosting the Institute. We appreciate their enthusiasm for 21st century learning and their generous hospitality.

FCIS Administrators' Retreat July 27-29, 2014

Forty-eight administrators gathered at the Hutchinson Island Marriott Resort and Marina for 3 days of workshops and relaxation!
