I am so appreciative to Suzanne for donating her time and resources to present this series at no charge to our member schools. If you missed any of the webinars, they are recorded and stored on the heads' portal on the FCIS website. In addition, the FCIS Office produced webinars on financial standards and on governministrators' Retreat, New Teacher Institute, and Anmedia, google apps, flipping the classroom, use of mobile devices in the classroom, human resource issues, crisis management and security, and the use of iPads.

The Florida High the new talent that is being drawn to this important School Athletic Association (FHSAA) met on June 11 and 12 for their regularly scheduled board meeting and addressed some of the changes that this particular law will require. Bylaw revisions, as required by the new law and approved by the FHSAA Board of Directors, may be found on the FHSAA website.

> **CAPE.** During this past legislative season, several states have expanded their school choice programs. Some of the significant changes have occurred in Louisiana, Arizona, Mississippi, and New Hampshire. Louisiana approved providing vouchers to students in schools that received a letter grade of C, D, or F. In addition, the Louisiana State Legislature approved a bill that would give tax rebates to individuals and corporations who donated to school tuition organizations. In Arizona, the legislature approved a bill that would expand the practice of the state making contributions to an account that could be accessed by parents of disabled students to include the same benefits to parents with students in low performing schools to attend their school of choice. Mississippi signed legislation that would expand educational options for dyslexic students, while New Hampshire increased the cap on corporate tax contributions that could be made to organizations granting student scholarships.
