several significant changes to FCIS. In April 2012, with the North Carolina Association of Independent Schools (NCAIS) to join the Virtual Independent School Network (VISNET). This network partners independent schools from North Carolina, Virginia, South Carolina, and Florida to provide quality electronic resources at a reduced rate. Second, in June 2012, FCIS was awarded a matching grant of \$50,000 from the Edward E. Ford Foundation; this grant along with contributions from member schools, other associations, and individuals has been used to start the Dale D. Regan Leadership Institute. The Leadership Institute is comprised of three programs - Prospective Heads Institute (PHI), FCIS New Heads Institute (FNHI), and the Experience Heads Institute (EHI). There are 23 participants in the 2012-13 PHI, and the first FNHI will be held July 25 - 27 at the Sheraton Sand Key Hotel. We are excited about the new possibilities that these changes bring to our association.

As a matter of note, we now have 160 schools in membership. Join me in welcoming our newest members, The First Academy in Orlando and Salah Tawfik Elementary and Middle School in Sunrise.

FCIS. The 57<sup>th</sup> Annual Convention, hosted by our Orlando schools, was a tremendous success, breaking the attendance record for conventions held in the central part of our state with 1740 attendees and 131 schools present. I want to take this opportunity to say a special thank you to our convention co-chairs, Warren Hudson of Lake Highland Preparatory School and Craig Maughan of Trinity Preparatory School, and all of the convention committee members who made this event possible. We are already making plans for the 58<sup>th</sup> Annual Convention, which will be held on November 7 and 8 again at the Orlando Hyatt Re-

gency International Airport Hotel. Co-chairs for this event are David Mahler of The Out-of-Door The 2012 year has flown by, and it has brought Academy and Kevin Plummer of Tampa Preparatory School. > ISM has just compiled its results from the ISM Faculty and Management Compensation Survey, 2011-12, after surveying a random sample of Ideas and Perspectives subscribers from independent day schools across the nation. The mean salary for school heads of day schools in 2011-12 was \$181,969. Salaries varied depending upon three factors: geography, school enrollment, and current operating budget. The mean head's salary for the South Atlantic, including Florida, was \$176,057.

> CAPE. A new report has just been released on charter schools indicating that of 60,000 charter school students in New York state came from 18,000 came from catholic schools. The cost to New York taxpayers is approximately \$320 million per vear. On a national level, enrollment in Catholic schools went from 2.5 million students in 1990 to 1.9 million in 2010. Enrollment in charter schools has gone from zero students in 1990 with the first charter school opening in 1992 to over two million students today.




