### from the executive director...

It is hard to believe that most of our FCIS schools have finished the first two months of the 2012-13 school year. Our schools have gotten off to a good state office is in full swing; in fact, the office tells me we are always in full swing. I take that as a positive sign that we are being more diligent in our efforts to meet the needs of our member schools.

FCIS Professional Development -By now, all of you should have received the FCIS Professional Development Calendar 2012-13 in a tri-fold that may be tacked to your bulletin/information board. To date, we have already completed the 2012 Administrator's Retreat, the New Teacher Institute, two technology workshops, two economic/financial workshops, a VISNET informational workshop, and six webinars on various topics. Our legal webinar series with Suzanne Bogdan began on September 14 and will continue through February; those webinars are already providing timely legal information to our schools. FCIS webinars continue to be archived on the heads' portal.

The Dale Regan Leadership Institute - In September, we kicked off the first of three leadership institutes, The Prospective Heads' Institute (PHI), we received from the Edward E. Ford Foundation. PHI has 22 participants stretching across the state of Florida. Participants have already engaged in an introductory webinar, featuring a panel of five heads of school at varying stages in their careers. In addition, the participants are participating in webinars on legal issues, governance, and finance. In January, they will Inn. > **CAPE** - The National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) Writing 2011 report indicates that 92% of private school students and 79% of public school students scored at the basic or higher level on the writing proficiency exam. Those students scoring at or above the proficiency level included 41% of private school students and 26% public school students. On the 2011-12 SAT National Scores, the mean score for writing was 548 for independent schools, 529 for religious schools, and 481 for public schools. The reading mean score was 539 for independent schools, 531 for religious schools, and 491 for public schools; the math mean score was 580 for independent schools, 534 for religious schools, and 505 for public schools.

funded in part by the \$50,000 matching grant that FCIS SAT SCORES 2011-12 - The mean score for FCIS schools in writing was 551, surpassing the national average for independent schools, as compared to 476 for the state of Florida. The reading mean score for FCIS schools was 550, again surpassing the national average for independent schools, as compared to 492 for all Florida schools. 

### Rethinking Learning: Engage, Create, Deliver!



A series of workshops, featuring Dr. Kate Kemker, an Apple curriculum specialist, was held on September 13 and 14 in Tallahassee and Jacksonville, respectively. Holy Comforter Episcopal School hosted a morning and afternoon session designed to demonstrate new ways of introducing skills, collaborative projects and self-designed course work. After a welcome from Peter Klekamp, Head of School, each 3-hour session allowed participants to explore new apps on iPads provided by Apple.

The following day, Charley Zimmer, Acting Head at Episcopal School of Jacksonville, welcomed the attendees to another day of exploration, discovery and sharing. Both workshops demonstrated apps that can be used in elementary, middle and upper school in language arts, science, math, history, social studies and art. In addition to classroom applications, the technology directors in attendance also discussed strategies for initial installation and infrastructure that would support a 1:1 iPad program.

## New Teacher Institute September 30—October 2

## September Workshops at the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta- Miami Branch

FCIS teachers had a rare opportunity to spend a day at the Federal Reserve Bank in Miami. Lower School teachers attended on September 20<sup>th</sup>. In addition to hands-on activities, student booklets, and worksheets, each teacher received a flash drive containing hundreds of age-appropriate, free resources for teaching money, savings, making choices, budgeting, and understanding the difference between "needs" and "wants". The following day, September 21<sup>st</sup>, middle and upper school teachers participated in activities that were appropriate for their students and also were given flash drives containing free resources for their students which included: establishing credit, investing, saving, living on a budget, building wealth, credit cards, identify theft and the functions of the Federal Reserve. All attendees were taken on a tour of the "money room" and given information about bringing their students on a field trip to the Reserve.

This workshop was filled with excellent teaching strategies and activities for educators working with children of all ages. We hope to continue this partnership and provide additional workshops in the future.
