Accreditation Sessions

Over 90 teachers, administrators and heads of school attended one, or more, of the four accreditation sessions offered at the November FCIS Convention. Topics covered included Chair training, preparing your school for an FCIS/FKC or a joint FCIS-SAIS/SACS evaluation, preparing for a Five Year Review visit, writing the self-study and the logistics of the actual visit. Many educators attended the training session to learn more about serving on an evaluation team. Service on a team is an outstanding form of professional development and encourages FCIS peer educators to step outside their current role and look "with BIG and objective eyes" at other educational programs. There is hardly a better way to learn and grow as an educator!

Special thanks to Tracy Ross and Sheri Rentzepis from The Cushman School for their presentation on writing the self-study with the use of Google Docs. They made it look so easy!

If you were unable to attend the November sessions, FCIS is offering two additional training sessions next semester. The Evaluation Academy, January 12 at Parkway Christian School, is open to Heads and Administrators (see information below). Additionally, the Administrator's Retreat, July 29-31 in Bonita Springs, will feature an afternoon workshop for schools preparing for their evaluation. I am also available to visit your campus to assist in any of the planning and preparation stages of the accreditation process! The Academy will also be offered in June, for Heads only, at the conclusion of the Heads' Retreat, the more relaxed two-day session.
