About the School:

About the Position:

Primary responsibilities:

- Provide a structured learning environment for young students that incorporates academic and social-emotional learning in developmental appropriate ways for students ages 4 and 5
- Promote healthy development of early academics through play, exploration, and collaboration
- Work collaboratively with the grade level and special areas teams to develop transdisciplinary programming
- Serve as an active member of the division
- Fully support PYP programming through design, instruction, assessment, and agency
- Communicate regularly with parents and student support personnel
- Model and foster professional standards of communication, personal presentation, punctuality, professional courtesy, collegiality, respect, and discretion.
- Be a team player; cheerfully participate in and/or assist with other duties and routines regularly part of a school environment
- Meet regular and timely attendance requirements, including occasional evening and other required events
- Adhere to School policies as described in the Employee Handbook and other materials



Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree in an appropriate field required; master's degree preferred
- Experience teaching at the early childhood level experience preferred
- Experience in an independent school preferred
- Experience with the IB/PYP Programme preferred
- A keen understanding of the academic, social and emotional development and needs of pre-school aged students
